#### **FACE COVERINGS**

As we are all aware circumstances and the advice that follows, changes very rapidly in these uncertain times. One of the hot topics over the last week is the mandatory introduction of the wearing of a face covering for people aged 12 and over in metropolitan Melbourne and Mitchell Shire.

# WHAT THIS MEANS FOR KENNINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL?

# Will face coverings be mandatory for teachers and students?

Currently it is not compulsory for anyone in regional or rural Victoria to wear face coverings.

Teachers, educators and carers can choose to wear face coverings if they wish when teaching or providing care for children.

The Victorian Chief Health Officer has advised that students across Victoria under the age of 12 do not have to wear face coverings. Therefore, it is up to the individual family to choose for their child / children to wear a face covering at school.

#### CONTINUATION OF ONSITE LEARNING

The current advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer is that 'the available evidence largely indicates that transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19) between children in the school environment at the current time is very low

and that the virus is generally milder in children than in adults.

Caution continues to be advised for students with complex medical needs. It is recommended that parents/carers of students with complex medical needs, seek advice from the student's medical practitioner to support decision-making about whether on-site education is suitable. It is important, however, that clinical risk be weighed against the consequences of a student missing the opportunity for face-to-face learning, particularly in the context of very low rates of coronavirus (COVID-19) transmission in Victoria.


## CURRICULUM DAY— STUDENT FREE DAY FRIDAY JULY 31

### REMOTE AND FLEXIBLE LEARNING—PARENT FEEDBACK

Thank you to all of our parents and carers who took the time to give us feedback about the Remote and Flexible Learning period during Term 2.

As I mentioned last week in the LINK, I would continue to share the results of the feedback that we received from our families.

87% of people believed that the learning planned by the teachers at Kennington was suitable for their child/children. 85% of respondents felt as though the learning tasks were easy / very easy to understand.

When asked about how accessible the learning documents were, 54% said that were easy to access and 34% said that access was very easy.

It is not recommended that students who live with someone who is at risk of severe illness from coronavirus (COVID-19) to remain at home at this time. Schools have put in place a range of measures to further reduce the risk of coronavirus (COVID-19) transmission and have clear protocols in place to quickly respond and manage a case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in a school. All students are expected to attend school.


#### STUDENT DROP OFF-MORNING
