### SCHOOL REVIEW UPDATE

Every 4 years all schools must participate in a school review. The school review process provides assurance of ongoing compliance with the minimum requirements for school registration, and informs the development of our next four year School Strategic Plan (SSP).

A school review is like a formative assessment applied to the whole school. Just as formative assessment enables teachers to support students with the question, 'what do I need to do next so I can improve?' A review assists schools to develop strategic responses to the question, 'what does our school need to do next so we can improve?

Last week we began our school review with the validation day, led by our reviewer John Haines. The validation day gives the review panel the opportunity to collectively assess where we are at as a school and to set the focus for the school review. One of the impacts of the last week's Circuit Breaker Lockdown was the postponement of our review days. With negotiation of our review panel we have set the following new dates for our review days.

Please note the following changes to our school review days; the major change for families to be aware of is the change of date for the curriculum day.

A reminder that **Monday June 14** is the Queen's Birthday Public Holiday, there will be no school on this day.

### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

The Victorian Government has announced

arrangements for schools in Victoria from and including Friday 4 June.

Based on advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, schools in regional Victoria will return to face-to-face learning for all students from and including Friday 4 June.

### **Face masks**

Secondary school students aged 12 or older must wear a face mask indoors at school, including when attending an Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) program, unless an exception applies. Face masks are required to be worn outdoors at school where physical distancing of 1.5m cannot be maintained.

Children under 12 years of age and students at primary school are not required to wear face masks when at school, or when attending an OHSC program.

Face masks are mandatory for all school staff and school students aged 12 or older when travelling to and from school.

### Visitors to school

Based on the current DET School Operations Guide visitors to school premises should be limited to essential school services and operations.

Visitors to school grounds must comply with physical distancing and face mask requirements set, and practise good hand hygiene.

The density limit of 1 person per 4 square metres should be applied to any spaces and activities being attended by parent/ carers and other visitors. The density limit applies to all persons in the space, including students.

To support contact tracing, schools must keep a record of all staff, students and visitors who attend on-site. Schools must record the full name, contact details, date, and time of attendance at school, as well as the areas of the school that the person attended. Please use the QR codes located around the school to check in.

- Wear a Face Mask
- Sign in using a QR Code
- Sanitise hands
- Maintain physical distancing
- Stay only as long as required

### WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM

### **Excerpt from Uniform Policy**

Winter Uniform (to be worn at the commencement of winter until at least the end of winter).

**Track pants** – black (with no trim in another colour).

**Straight leg pants** - black (not jeans) without visible pockets.

**Skivvy** – yellow, bottle green or black. **KPS Polo shirt** – combinations of bottle green and black with yellow Kennington logo.

**KPS Rugby top** – combinations of bottle green, yellow and black with Kennington logo.

**KPS Tunic** – black watch tartan tunic. **KPS Jacket** – zip from with hood in collar – bottle green with yellow and black trim and Kennington Primary School embroidered on the back.

All vouchers have an expiry date and must be used by the end date. Please note that expired vouchers will not be re-issued for this package. Vouchers will be sent to the school.
