SUNSMART – SLAP ON A HAT

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


KPS Specialist Subjects Update - 29th August

Students in Grades Prep to Grade 2 watched a story book in Auslan to celebrate Book week last week, highlighting the challenges of watching the interpreter as well as the illustrations. The Grade 3 to Grade 6 students have begun work on their weather reports this week with a focus on HOLME and Auslan grammar. Students are creating a script in Auslan to be videoed at the end of term.
