# DROPPING OFF YOUR CHILD AT THE SCHOOL ROUNDABOUT

Thank you to our families who have supported our expectations about the way in which we use the drop off roundabout in the mornings. It is great to see that we have so many independent students at Kennington who can dropped off in the mornings. A reminder for kids to be ready to hop out of their car as soon as it is stopped it is one of the three green bays.

I have again included a map in this week's LINK to remind families about the safest way to drop your children off in the mornings. Children should only exit the vehicle when it is in one of the three green bays unless a staff member indicates for them to exit. This may occur in special circumstances (inclement weather etc.).

#### NATIONAL SORRY DAY MAY 26

National Sorry Day is a day to acknowledge the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation. While this date carries great significance for the Stolen Generations and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, it is also commemorated by Australians right around the country.

The first National Sorry Day was held on 26 May 1998, one year after the Bringing Them Home report was tabled in Parliament. The Bringing Them Home report is a result of a Government Inquiry into the past policies which caused children to be removed from their families and communities in the 20th century.

Following this, in 2000, there was one issue that was high on the agenda at the Sydney Harbour Bridge walk for reconciliation – an apology to the Stolen Generations.

As a school we will commemorate National Sorry Day at our afternoon assembly tomorrow.

#### NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives - where we live, work, and socialise.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates for NRW are the same each

year; 27 May to 3 June.

These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

27 May 1967 - On this day, Australia's most successful referendum saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

3 June 1992 - On this day, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddie Koiki Mabo's challenge to the legal fiction of 'terra nullius' (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
