Dear Parents/Carers,

### ANAPHYLAXIS AND ASTHMA

We have several children enrolled who suffer from severe allergies to a variety of things including nuts and nut products that can result in them going into anaphylactic shock. Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening. It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention.

At KPS several strategies are in place to deal with this. If students bring nuts or nut products to school, they should

inform their teacher. They will be asked to remain in a particular area while eating and to wash their hands after eating. Touching door handles, shared classroom resources including pencils and even play equipment outside after handling nuts or nut products can be hazardous. Often boxes and packages are sent to school for art construction activities and are very useful. However, do not send any packages for use at school that have contained nuts or nut products so that we can minimise the risk of children with allergies coming into contact with products that may cause a reaction. Action Plans for Anaphylaxis and also for Asthma are required for all children who suffer from either, and must be obtained from the family doctor. Please ensure that your child has an updated plan if they suffer from asthma or are at risk of experiencing anaphylaxis. A copy of this plan must be provided to the school immediately.

## Smile Squad is coming to this school.

The Smile Squad team from Bendigo Health are coming to our school in July 2023.

Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program.

This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

### How to access free dental care

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian.

Paper copies of the consent form are available. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

### Smile Squad dental packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

### Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

Smile Squad offers the following services to all Victorian government school students:

- free oral health promotion
- free annual dental health check-ups
- free follow-up treatment as needed.

All Smile Squad services comply with the highest safety and quality requirements.

## Annual dental health check-ups

After consent has been provided, at the first appointment (the check-up), Smile Squad will check the student's teeth and provide preventive care.

Dental health check-ups will usually be delivered in a room on the school site using portable dental equipment (portable chair, portable tools, for example).

Services may include:

- teeth cleaning
- x-rays of teeth
- fluoride varnish application
- fissure sealants
- advice about dental health and diet.

The check-up will be approximately 15 minutes long.

## Follow-up treatment

If a student needs follow-up treatment, Smile Squad will **seek consent from parents and carers**, and make a second appointment. Usually, this appointment takes place in a treatment van on the school site. The van will have a fully functioning single-chair dental clinic set up.

More complex treatments may need to occur at the local Smile Squad community dental agency. These extra treatments are also **completely free of charge**.

Depending on the student's needs, treatment services may include:

- restorations (fillings)
- root canals
- extractions
- all other general treatment required.

If the student doesn't need follow-up treatment, Smile Squad will see them again in 12 months.

The program does not include orthodontics or cosmetic treatment.

**All services are provided free of charge. There are no out of pocket costs for parents and carers.**
