#### SUNSMART - SLAP ON A HAT

The skin on your face, neck and ears is much thinner and more sensitive to UV damage than other skin on your body.

School council approved hats can be purchased from our uniform supplier, LOWES at the Marketplace, and at our front office.

Please ensure your child has a clearly named water bottle, filled with water, for use at school, every day. The drink bottle is kept in the classroom and is easily accessible during learning time.

It can be refilled as needed during break times. Having a drink bottle in the

classroom avoids loss of learning time when children need to exit the room to drink from a bubbler.

#### **BEFORE SCHOOL SUPERVISION**

A reminder to all families and students that if students arrive to school prior to classes beginning at 8:50am they have a couple of options. If students are with their parents, then they can stay with them until the bell goes.

If students are by themselves, they can attend Morning Club Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Or on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday they can attend Breakfast Club.

Other than these options, all students are required to go to the amphitheatre and wait for the bell. Please remember that the playground equipment is not to be used during this time.

#### RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS TOPIC 5 – STRESS MANAGEMENT

### **Cricket Blast School Cup**

Last Friday, Swan Hill hosted the Regional Cricket Championships, featuring two qualifying teams from Kennington Primary School. These teams earned their spots after emerging victorious in the Boys and Girls Division Tournament held in Bendigo. The competition unfolded with three pool games in sweltering conditions, culminating in a Grand Final between the pool winners.

Kennington's Boys team kicked off strongly, securing a 60-run victory against Murrabit in their first match. However, they faced a formidable challenge in their second encounter against St Mary's Swan Hill. Despite a solid start with the bat, Kennington faced a setback as St Mary's took quick wickets, ultimately narrowly defeating Kennington. The third pool match against Campaspe proved to be the toughest, with soaring temperatures. Kennington bowled impressively, taking 5 quick wickets for only 4 runs. Despite the quick wickets Campaspe displayed resilient batting and the Kennington Team couldn't match the final score. It was a fantastic effort by the Boys teams to reach the Regional Finals, showcasing outstanding performances from all players.

The Girls team commenced their day against the talented Koondrook team, securing an 8-run victory with Mackenzie H's impressive 4-wicket over. In the second pool match against St Mary's Swan Hill, Kennington faced a challenge as St Mary's took 6 wickets, but Kennington's solid performance, including 5 wickets and numerous dot balls, resulted in a victory by over 40 runs. The third pool match against Campaspe presented the most formidable challenge, with Kennington ultimately winning by just 6 runs, securing their place in the Grand Final against Kyabram as the only undefeated girls' team.

In the Grand Final, Kyabram set a challenging total with their best player scoring 40 in two overs. Despite a spirited effort by Kennington, including a last-wicket stand of 24 by Georgia S and Amelia C, they were unable to outscore Kyabram, who also took 6 wickets. The Girls' team concluded the day as Runners-up for the Region, a remarkable achievement.

A special acknowledgment goes to all the players who participated, and sincere thanks to the parents for their support. Appreciation is also extended to Mr. Monaghan and Mrs. Maddren for their coaching and umpiring contributions throughout the day.


### **Pupil Free Day**
