## MATHEMATICS NEWS

## Mathematics Home Learning 2024

Firstly, I would like to congratulate students for their engagement in the Mathematics Home Learning program so far. The initial signs are that students are engaged and focussed on learning their number facts. Thank-you to families for supporting and encouraging your child/ren to do that regular maths practise. The feedback from parents has been positive, with most acknowledging the ease of doing the number fact practise and that they are preferring the number fact worksheet over the previous computer based maths home learning program.

The number fact home learning sheets the teachers send home will have an explanation of the strategy that your child is encouraged to use when solving the equations. The back side of the sheet includes a list of questions for practise. We encourage students to hand-write the first three columns and then leave the last column blank. We hope that by the time your child gets to the last column, they should be solving the equations mentally. This mental practise should continue until your child is able to solve the equations quickly and accurately. Most of the practise sheets will also include a
link to an online game that could be used in conjunction to the sheet. Here is an example:

When the children have finished, they will receive their finishing time which is written on their name tag. They will then proceed immediately to the recording table in finishing order to have their name, time and team recorded. After each group race has finished no child is to leave the finishing area. Children will return to school in age groups.
e.g. (a) $8 / 9$ and 10 Years together
(b) 11 and 12 Years together

All children are welcome to wear their house colours \& black shorts (or their KPS uniform - this is not an out of uniform day), hat and appropriate footwear to school. If your child is unable to participate a note is required. Children can bring their own drinks in a named drink bottle with them to the run at the reservoir. Permission for this activity has already been given by you through the Major Sporting Events permission form at the beginning of 2024.
